Class structure

Classes:

Austin Healey Standard Classes:

- Class 1: 100 Standard
- Class 2: 100/6 plus 3000 MkI & MkII Standard
- Class 3: 3000 MkIIA & MkIII Standard
- Class 4: Sprite MkI Standard
- Class 5: Sprite MkII, MkIII and MkIV Standard

Austin Healey Modified Classes:

- Class 6: 100, 100/6, 3000 MkII & MkIII Modified
- Class 7: Sprite MkI, MkII, MkIII and MkIV Modified

Non Austin Healeys:

- Class 8: Warwick Healeys, Jensen Healeys and Nash Healeys,

Rules:

- Cars must be in a road worthy legal condition.
- Cars must be driven to the event. Trailers/transporters are not allowed.
- The class winner in each class will be the car with the highest number of marks in that class.
- Any complaints concerning the concours must be made in writing to the concours chairman or his/her deputy and a reply will be given in writing.
- Marks may be deducted by discretion of the concours judge where items are considered to be in a dangerous condition.
- Marks will not be deducted where parts have been fitted for safety reasons, i.e. seat belts, fire extinguisher etc.
- During judging the entrant must remain with the car or deputy a representative to be in attendance.
- The definition of standard and modified classes is as follows:
 - **Standard classes:**
As near as possible to the specification it left the factory
 - **Modified classes:**
Tastefully modified to enhance the appearance and specifications but maintain the basic theme of Healey cars.
- Preparation and polishing will not be allowed during judging
- The concours chairman and judge's decision is final and they will not enter into any discussion concerning the marks and results.
